Tour Itinerary

Day 1 Arrival Taipei



Upon arrival in Taipei, you will receive meet and greet service at the arrival hall followed by private transfer to your hotel. Note standard hotel check-in time is at 3pm.
Hint: Must try Taiwan's iconic drink - Bubble tea. There are many tea shops for your choice.
Accommodation: 3* Hotel Cloud Taipei or similar



Day 2 Taipei Day Tour (B)



After breakfast, let's start our plentiful sightseeing tour. First stop is followed by a photo stop opportunity at the presidential office building followed by a must visit to the Chiang Kai-shek memorial hall where you may witness the changing of the Guard. Next we will briefly stop at the Grand Hotel Taipei, The Grand Hotel is Taiwan's first five-star hotel, established in 1952 by Madam Chiang, Soong Mei-ling. The 14-storey palace like building, with its vermilion columns, gilded tiles and a magnificent, grandiose, regal and classic presence, is an embodiment of eastern aesthetics and one of Taipei's representative landmarks. After lunch, you will continue to the National Palace Museum (Tickets included). The NPM houses large collections of artefacts, paintings and books from the Song, Yuan, Ming and Qing Dynasties. The museum has more than 690,000 pieces of Chinese imperial artefacts and artworks which covers more than 5000 years of historical achievement. Finally, continue to Four Four South Village where is one of the few military villages remaining. Also here is a perfect spot for you to capture Taipei 101. Take photos with one of the city's most iconic landmarks and the Taiwan tallest building.
Hint: Taiwan is truly heaven for foodies. Wide range of restaurants are around the hotel and all over the city.
Accommodation: 3* Hotel Cloud Taipei or similar



Day 3 Taipei>Jiufen>Shifen Waterfall>Pingxi>Hsinchu (B)



After breakfast, your tour will start with a visit to Jiufen, a location that got its name because there were once only nine families who lived there. During the late 18th century, the area became very prosperous when gold was discovered. Tourists can still experience the glorious old days while walking through the old architectures and teahouses, there is a wide variety of local food along Jiufen street. In the afternoon, we will continue to Shifen Waterfall in Pingxi District, widely known as the "Little Niagara Falls" of Taiwan. There are several viewing platforms near Shifen Waterfall, where you can see the waterfall from different angles, even have a close up look. On sunny days, a beautiful rainbow may be created by the mist of this 20-meter tall waterfall as it splashes into the lake. The Shifen old street is lined with souvenir shops, sky lantern shops and eateries. You can also see many people set up their sky lanterns on the railway track, getting ready to release them into the sky. One sky lantern which share with 3-4 people (Tickets included). You can write down your wishes on the lantern and release it to the sky, so you can fully enjoy the tranquil and peaceful moment. Continue to your hotel in Hsinchu in late afternoon.
Hint: Having your wishes ready for the sky lantern

Day 4 Hsinchu<Sun Moon Lake>Chiayi (B)



After breakfast, we travel towards to Sun Moon Lake. The journey will take approximately 3 hours before arrival in Sun Moon Lake. Today's highlight is to explore the Sun-Moon-Lake by sightseeing cruise (Tickets included). Across the lake and you will take in the spectacular view of Xuan-Guang Temple, and Lalu Island. Sun Moon Lake is located in the heart of Taiwan, which is surrounded by lush misty peaks and tea plantations. It has an elevation of 748 meters above sea level which creates the picturesque scenery of the lake. The encircling green mountains, lakeshore walking & cycling trails, and the passion of the local Thao indigenous people further make this a destination worth experiencing. In the afternoon, we will visit the famous black tea museum, Hohocha (Tickets included), where you smell the fragrance of tea before even drinking your first cup. Heading to Chiayi in the late afternoon. Overnight at Chiayi.
Hint: Wenhua Road night market offers a decent selection of Taiwanese street food.
Accommodation: 3* Orange Hotel Chiayi or similar



Day 5 Chiayi>Alishan>Chiayi (B)



After breakfast, we will head towards Alishan National Park (Tickets included). There are eighteen mountains surrounding Alishan, making up the ridge of Jade Mountain – one of Taiwan’s most extensive mountain ranges. The natural valley and basin with high mountains, forest slopes, and steep terrain combine to form Alishan - a location not to be missed! Lunch (Own expense) at Alishan Recreation Area before taking the Alishan Forest Rail (Tickets included) to explore this region highlights this as a once in a lifetime experience for most Taiwanese people. The Alishan Forest Railway was originally constructed for logging activities during the Japanese colonial period. It has become a popular tourist attraction over the years, because of its unique Z-shaped switchbacks, 47 tunnels and 72 wooden bridges. After leaving Alishan, visit the Fenqihu village where it is definitely worth a stop before returning to Chiayi in the late afternoon.
Hint: Take a short walk of 1-1.5 hours along the walking trail, and return by train.
Accommodation: 3* Orange Hotel Chiayi or similar



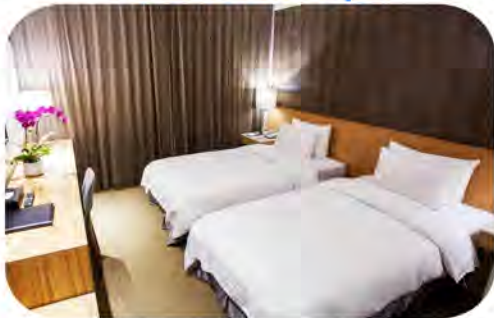
Day 6 Chiayi>Lukang>Taoyuan Airport (B)



After hotel breakfast, we will visit Hinoki Village. This village was originally the dormitories of the Chiayi Forest division of Forestry Bureau of the Taiwan Governor General Office during the Japanese rule of Taiwan where it also known as Taiwan's little Kyoto. The village consists of 28 wooden Japanese-style dormitories and you can experience Japanese kimono and take photos in Japanese style garden. Continue toward Lukang. Today's highlight is exploring one of the oldest towns in Taiwan, Lukang. The red brick streets of the Lukang Old Street area are lined with traditional buildings and snack shops. The grand Lukang Longshan Temple features carved dragon poles and garden courtyards. Next we travel to Lukang Tianhou Temple which has Qing dynasty inscriptions. We will visit an art village to see local crafts and perhaps bring back a souvenir or two. Lunch is planned at Lukang which has delicious seafood, baked goods, and distinctive street food which are part of Lukang's signature appeal. Continue to Taoyung Airport (TPE) before leaving beautiful Taiwan. Please book your flight to depart TPE airport after 20:00 pm. There are still many places awaiting you to explore in Taiwan. Look forward to see you again in the near future.
